## Call for Abstracts

Paris Dauphine-PSL University, Toulouse School of Economics and the National Museum of Natural History invite the submission of papers and abstracts for the 24th Global Conference on Environmental Taxation (GCET), to be held in Paris on September 6 to 8, 2023. The theme for this year's conference is "Climate & Biodiversity: tackling global footprints". More information about the conference can be found at [www.gcet24.fr](http://www.gcet24.fr).

### The conference

The scientific program for GCET24 will cover issues relating to environmental taxation and focus on economic tools to tackle mitigation issues, biodiversity losses and climate vulnerability, including but not limited to:

- Challenges of agriculture and forestry for carbon sequestration, non-CO2 GHG and biodiversity,
- Challenges of urban areas for land use, CO2 emissions and climate-resilience,
- Supranational regulations to tackle domestic and imported CO2 emissions and biodiversity losses, with a special focus on the recent reform of EU-ETS,
- Business and biodiversity : Economical and financial risks and opportunities associated with the decline of biodiversity, nature-based solutions.

In line with the tradition, a selection of the best contributions will also be published this year in the prestigious "*Critical issues in environmental taxation*" from Edward Elgar publishers.

One of the key objectives of GCET is the promotion of junior contributions and the fostering of state-of-the-art scientific research. Accordingly, any student or researcher younger than age 35 can be a candidate for the "**GCET24 Young Researcher Award**".

The conference will feature a series of parallel sessions exploring a wide range of topics relating to charges, fees, taxes, subsidies, tax expenditures, emissions trading and voluntary approaches from economic, legal and policy perspectives. According to the tradition of the GCET conferences, abstracts by academic scholars are encouraged as well as abstracts from experts representing national or international administrations and organizations, and from experts of the private sector.

### Submission Guidelines

All abstracts must be submitted in Word format (.doc or .docx files) to [gcet24@gmail.com](mailto:gcet24@gmail.com). Please use the subject heading "GCET24 Abstract submission."

#### Length, format and style of abstracts:

Abstracts should not exceed 400 words. No figures, tables, footnotes, endnotes or other references should be included in the abstract. Please use Times New Roman (TNR), 12 pt., left alignment, single spaced, with a line between paragraphs. The title should be centered in TNR 12 pt., bold, with initial capitals. The name of the author and any co-authors should be placed below the title in TNR of 12 pt., bold and centered. The name of the presenting author must be underlined.

#### Biographical information about the presenting author:

At the end of the abstract, please include a paragraph of up to 150 words with main biographical details of the presenting author. These bios may be included in the conference's book of abstracts.

**The submission deadline is June 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023.** Abstracts will be accepted on a rolling basis, so that early notifications might be made, allowing participants to register early for the conference.

#### Paper Submission:

After an abstract is accepted the submission deadline for draft full papers is September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023. Full papers should not exceed 6,000 words, including figures, tables, footnotes, endnotes and other references. Authors should strictly adhere to this word limit. More information about the requirements for full papers will be provided when abstracts are accepted.
